Respect is a vital ingredient in any peaceful and caring community. Children need to know why it is important, and to whom and how to show respect, and that there are consequences for not showing respect.

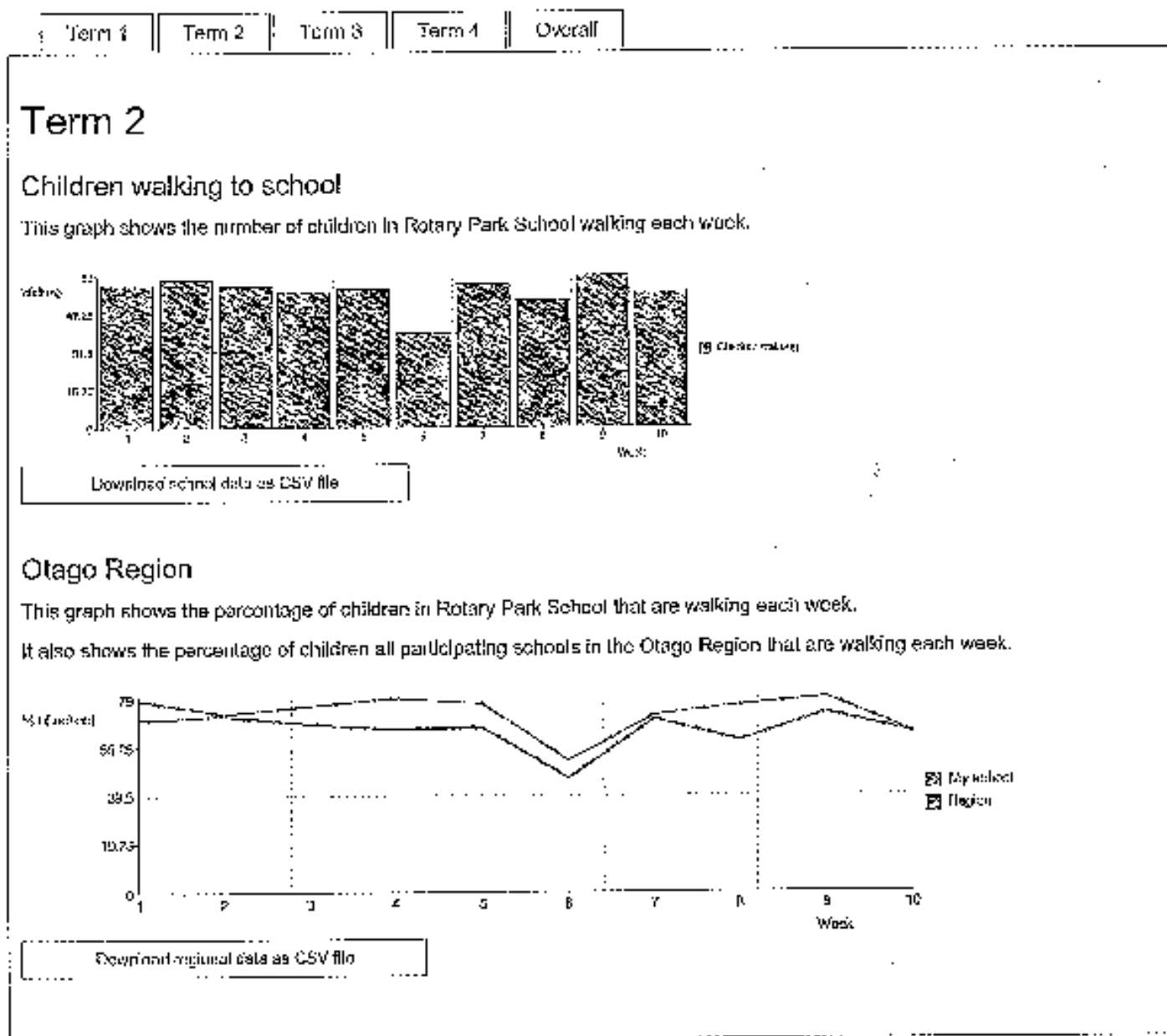
